
Signs of Hope


ncient Chinese wisdom teaches us to see change as an *opportunity* rather than a threat. Change calls us to live from a deeper place, and to see that community, imagination, and creativity are our greatest strengths as we move forward into the future.

In community, we brothers challenge ourselves to discern the opportunities offered to us in the actual circumstances of our life. During the past months, we have been involved in several projects which are responses to our changing times. For us they are signs of hope and newness.

NEW RAMPING IN THE MONASTERY. As the years progress, brothers' physical needs are changing. The portion of the Priory which we call the "dormitory" (our living space) was built almost forty years ago. A lovely, multi-level building, flights of stairs connect the major spaces of the monastery (chapel, dining room, community room, library, and brother's rooms). The building was designed and built when there was—understandably—not much thought about future needs and greater accessibility. Looking ahead to the future, we want to make all the areas of the monastery as accessible as possible, so that brothers can be involved in our common life as fully as possible. In late winter, we initiated the construction of ramps which will link each level of the monastery.

SOLAR PANELS. Stewardship of the earth is a value reaching all the way back to the beginning of the Benedictine monastic tradition. All of creation—each living creature, the fruits of the earth, the waterways and the rocky hills—must be reverenced "as the vessels of the altar."

Yet we live in an age of environmental crisis: the earth is degraded, its resources hoarded and depleted, and our ecological future threatened by toxins and greed. Environmental responsibility is a central moral imperative of


our time; faithful stewardship of the earth is a dimension of our faith commitment. With the generous help of our friends, Jim Grundy and Nancy Bruce, we installed solar panels on a south-facing roof of the monastery. Reducing our consumption of fossil fuels, solar energy now heats our domestic hot water. Though the ecological challenges facing us are great, hope calls us to find concrete ways to put our stewardship into practice.
